Your recent request for information is replicated below, together with our response.

Police Scotland's protocol for armed officers responding to incidents involving dogs.

Police Scotland's protocol for how armed officers engage with dogs deemed dangerous.

Protocol for discharging a firearm at an out-of-control dog.

Please be advised that the above requested information is publicly available.

As such, in terms of Section 16 of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002, I am refusing to provide you with the information sought. Section 16 requires Police Scotland when refusing to provide such information because it is exempt, to provide you with a notice which:

- (a) states that it holds the information,
- (b) states that it is claiming an exemption,
- (c) specifies the exemption in question and
- (d) states, if that would not be otherwise apparent, why the exemption applies.

I can confirm that Police Scotland holds the information that you have requested and the exemption that I consider to be applicable is set out at Section 25(1) of the Act - information otherwise accessible:

"Information which the applicant can reasonably obtain other than by requesting it under Section 1(1) is exempt information".

All Authorised Firearms Officers (AFOs) in the Police Scotland are trained to the standards set by the College of Policing and contained within the National Police Firearms Training Curriculum (NPFTC).

The 'Criteria for the deployment of AFOs' is contained within the Authorised Professional Practice (APP) document for Armed Policing which sets out guidance to Forces nationally in the UK in response to incidents where Armed Response may be appropriate.
