Your recent request for information is replicated below, together with our response.

I understand that the former Chief Constable met with the First Minister in June this year.

Can you tell me if any record was kept of this meeting?

Is it normal policy for meetings with members of the Scottish government to be minuted by the police?

In terms of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 a public authority is only obliged to provide recorded information.

Under Section 8 of the Act, information which requires opinion or a yes/no response is not in essence a valid request.

To be of assistance I can advise there were no meetings between the Chief Constable and the First Minister scheduled in June 2023.

If you remain dissatisfied following our review response, you can appeal to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner (OSIC) within 6 months - <u>online</u>, by <u>email</u> or by letter (OSIC, Kinburn Castle, Doubledykes Road, St Andrews, KY16 9DS).

Following an OSIC appeal, you can appeal to the Court of Session on a point of law only.
