FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

I refer to your recent request for information which has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

For ease of reference, your request is replicated below together with the response.

To request the number of staffed police stations in Scotland for each of the past ten years up to and including 2022 (as at December 1, 2022).

Please send the number broken down by Division.

The data presented has been extracted from Police Scotland's System to Co-ordination Personnel and Establishment (SCOPE) database.

The data is provided as at 31 March in each year, *except* for the final column which has been provided at 30 November 2022* in order to capture the closest recorded data.

The data is provided broken down by division, however please note that it is possible that one location can serve more than one division (incl. specialisms not listed separately) and therefore any totalling of the figures may include duplication of locations. Each location is counted once for each division that has officers based at that location (as per SCoPE).

It should also be taken into consideration that although the data provided includes police stations, it also includes any other locations where police officers are based as per SCoPE, for example: airports, ports, schools, etc.

On that basis the data below is provided.

Your request must specify the matter which gives rise to your dissatisfaction and it must be submitted within 40 working days of receiving this response - either by email to foi@scotland.police.uk or by post to Information Management (Disclosure), Police Scotland, Clyde Gateway, 2 French Street, Dalmarnock, G40 4EH.

If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision. You can apply online, by email to enquiries@itspublicknowledge.info or by post to Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner, Kinburn Castle, Doubledykes Road, St Andrews, Fife, KY16 9DS.

Should you wish to appeal against the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner's decision, there is an appeal to the Court of Session on a point of law only.
